We're all concerned about the spread of the Coronavirus. It's almost all you hear about these days, and rightly so. To ensure the health and safety of our volunteers and staff, we have postponed our attendance at Catholic conferences throughout the USA until further notice.

Conferences play a key role in educating Catholic communities about our efforts to revive the Roman Catholic Church in Eastern Russia, our charitable work, and the development of our ever-growing vocations program. In light of current events, we now focus on other ways to inform US Catholics of our work. But we need your help! You can play an important role by serving as a mission helper right where you live. 

We humbly pray for your donations to continue the very important works of the mission. Three of our programs are profiled below.

- Our 6 **Women's Support Centers** help hundreds of families each year by providing family counseling, assisting moms in crisis pregnancies, collecting and distributing used baby clothes, and much more. Our centers have helped save over 3,000 babies from abortions! One center costs \$700-\$900/month to run, depending on the number of people helped. Programs include Adopt A Birth where a \$50 donation saves a baby from abortion, simply by covering the mother's hospital needs; and Adopt A Mom where \$125 provides pre- and post-natal care for a mother and clothing and supplies for her newborn.
- "Glory to God!" is the only way to respond to our **booming vocations.** Our vocations are in Russia, Indonesia, the Philippines, Vietnam, Kazakhstan, Pakistan, India and now the USA! All religious are supported by our mission. There are 29 Seminarians, 3 Deacons, 10 new Priests and 3 Brothers. The annual living and education expenses range from about \$6,200 to \$10,700 for one seminarian, depending on the country and need for air travel—a fraction of the cost in the USA. However, with so many seminarians, the expenses are sometimes overwhelming. Can you help?
- **Project Hope** helps individuals who are facing medical crises. The Project has helped cover major surgeries, cataract surgeries, medications to prevent stroke, biopsies for cancer detection, and diabetic supplies. Beneficiaries submit verifiable documentation from their medical prescriber.
